Introduction

Reports

At the end of last week, you will have received your child's school report. After considering feedback from last year, you can see that staff are now providing overall comments along with the key information on effort/attitude, progress and attainment. We hope that this has given you clear, specific and more meaningful information which summaries achievements and helps to identify areas for improvement next year.

We continue to encourage constructive feedback though, especially when we are still adapting a relatively new format, and we will take these views into account when considering end of year reports next summer.

School Day

A reminder again that in accordance with new statutory requirements for schools that come into force from September 2024 regarding the length of the school day, the gates will open at <u>8.40</u> and all children will be required to be in school by <u>8.45</u> from September onwards. We will continue to finish at <u>3.15</u>.

A polite reminder that when you pick your child up at the end of the school day, please can you ensure that your child remains with you and does not go and play unaccompanied on the grass area near to the fence or the bike racks as this has raised a number of safety issues.

School Trips

We are very pleased that we can offer your child such a rich and diverse range of trips during their time with us at primary school. However, we do understand that in the current financial climate, these trips can be expensive, and costs mount up. Therefore, from September 2024 any child who is entitled to Free School Meals (part of our Pupil Premium Funding and <u>not</u> Universal Infants Free School Meals) will now have the full cost of all school trips paid for.

Yr6 SATs Results

We were once again delighted with our Yr6 SATs results which were released on the 9th July. Although these results can never provide a fully rounded picture of each unique individual here, they are a culmination of a lot of hard work from pupils and teachers alike over their time at Swanton Morley Primary School. As you will see from the table below our results compare very favourably with the national average, and we are extremely proud of this.

Attendance

I would like to highlight some important and significant changes to the national guidance on attendance, and how it may affect you as parents/carers.

As from the *19 August 2024* the national guidance on Working Together to Improve School Attendance becomes statutory. The majority of the guidance impacts on how maintained schools, Academies, Local Authorities and external partners, will work towards supporting students in improving their attendance where this is needed.

However, there are some key parts which will affect you as parents /carers and these are summarised below:

- <u>Attendance codes are changing</u> You may see that existing codes have been removed and new codes have been added when we share your child's attendance record with you.
- <u>Fixed Penalty Notice Fines (FPNs) are increasing</u>
 These are a legal intervention by the Local Authority for unauthorised absences such as: term time holiday (Code G), where reasons for absence have not been provided or are unsatisfactory (Code O), where a student is persistently late after the registers close (Code U).

 Please see attached information sheet for full details of changes. A further letter will be sent to all parents/carers in September.

- Long Term Sickness (Physical or Mental ill health) We appreciate that there are times when a child is too unwell to attend school and would not expect them to attend in these circumstances. However, under the new guidance we now have a statutory duty to report to the Local Authority those students who are off through illness (Code I) under the following circumstances:
 - Student is unable to attend through illness and there are reasonable grounds to believe they will miss 15 or more *consecutive* school days. Or
 - 2. The student has reached or exceeded **15** school days absence through illness in the current academic year either *consecutive or cumulative*.

So that we can review and consider the most appropriate support for your child under these circumstances, and to ensure absences are appropriately recorded, we must now request that medical evidence be provided from your child's GP or another medical practitioner.

Behaviour/Language

There have been a concerning number of recent incidents where children have been reported to be using inappropriate language at break/lunch times. As we look ahead to the next academic year, please can you remind your child about the importance of the language that they are using in line with our Behaviour Policy.

Sports Day

It was fantastic to see how much the children and parents enjoyed Sports Day again this year. We are very fortunate with the facilities that we have here and I thought the balance between competition, inclusivity and support for all children taking part was a joy to see. The children were an absolute credit to themselves and the school. It was also great to see so many adults taking part in the parents' races – you can certainly see where some of that competitive edge comes from! Thank you again to the staff for organising such a successful and enjoyable event.

Church Service

The end of year celebration service which took place at All Saint's Church on Thursday 12th July was a lovely occasion. I would like to thank Rev Rachael for hosting us so well and for everybody that took part. I thought that the readers did especially well as they had to contend with a rather badly-behaved microphone, and it was also really nice to be able to say a proper goodbye to those adults that are leaving us. Thank you to Ms Madeley for helping to put the whole service together.

Friends of Swanton Morley (FOSM)

The Sponsored Walk, Garage Sale and Discos (as well as the after-school ice cream stall which pops up on sunny days) have proved to be very successful again this term. As a result, we have raised a considerable amount of money for the school. FOSM have recently spoken to the School Council and have some great ideas in the pipeline for how to spend the money...so watch this space! I would like to thank FOSM again for all of their hard work, but we still need more volunteers if we are going to be able to continue with these kinds of successful events next year. Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued **after 19th August 2024**.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: • £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

- . The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:
- . £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

- The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.
- Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
