Introduction

Classes

I am now in a position to inform you of the changes to teaching staff from January 2025.

Birch Class

We will be very sad to say goodbye to Mrs Powell at the end of this term but would like to thank her for the tremendous amount of dedication and hard work that she has put in with a number of different classes during her time here.

I am delighted to inform you that Mr Kearse has been appointed on a full-time permanent basis to take over in Birch class after Christmas. As part of the transition, he will be coming into school to meet the children during this half term and spending some time with Mrs Powell to ensure the best possible hand over. Mr Kearse has written a lovely introductory letter to the children in Birch class which I will be sending out separately.

Oak Class

We really look forward to welcoming Miss Vincent back from maternity leave on a part-time permanent basis after Christmas. She will be teaching in Oak class on a Thursday & Friday. I am also very pleased to inform you that Mrs Sifleet will be returning to cover the other days in Oak class on a Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday. Once again there will be a full hand over as part of the transition arrangements with both teachers coming into school towards the end of this half term. I can confirm that the new arrangements in Oak class have been put in place for the rest of this academic year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Bragger for stepping in and covering Oak class so capably for the majority of this term.

Parents Evenings

All appointments will now take place in the school hall. Communication

Service Children

Please see the information below from Holly Whiting, our new Service Pupil Champion:

My name is Mrs Whiting, and I am a Teaching Assistant and a Midday Supervisory Assistant currently working within School. I have recently been assigned the role of 'Service Pupil Champion'. I am a member of the Armed Forces community myself and I feel passionately about the special lifestyle that Forces children and families live.

If your child has been registered as a Service Pupil this means they have a parent/carer/close family member that has been in the Armed Forces.

The way this is logged in school is very important for the Government to recognise how special Forces families are and the unique challenges service life can bring. In School we have extra provisions currently in-place specifically to support your child/children.

We feel it is important for children to receive help and support with whatever they may need. This may be in terms of academic, emotional, or pastoral support providing stability through deployments, periods of separation or other stressful events i.e., relocations, transition to civilian life or a change in family circumstances and dynamics.

We can also support you by letting you know how your child is coping at school through challenging periods and what we are doing to help.

School Refurbishments

Over the October half term, I am extremely pleased to let you know we have had our rather old, temperamental and inefficient boilers replaced by the LA scheme that we are a part of (cost to LA: £85,000). The school will now be running off gas rather than oil.

Also, we have been able to use the governments energy efficiency grant (\pounds 13,000) to replace a large number of lights in the school with LED fittings/bulbs.

In addition, the network cabling for our IT system and brand-new computers (purchased in summer 2024) was also replaced over half term.

It's fair to say that it was a busy old week but this should all contribute to making the school much more up to date, energy efficient and help us to save some muchneeded money!

Attendance

As you are aware, we have recently sent out updated information from the DfE/LA on rules around attendance. We continue to monitor attendance very carefully and I will only authorise absence in 'exceptional' circumstances. Healthy Eating

We actively encourage healthy eating across the school as part of our curriculum teaching about healthy lifestyles. Therefore, please can you ensure that children only bring water to school (unless there is specified medical advice) and that the children do not have chocolate, sweets or sugary drinks in their packed lunches.

Cold Weather Gear

Please can we also remind you to send your child into school with a warm coat, hat, gloves etc. as the weather turns colder so that we are able to keep children playing outside happily for as long as possible at break times/lunchtimes.

Parking

Parking continues to be a problem outside of the school despite repeated requests to park considerately for the safety of <u>all</u> our children. Please report any safety issues to the local police and Norfolk County Council (NCC).

If you are able to give yourselves just a few more minutes in the morning, I would once again remind you that the village hall car park is the safest option and only a very short walk from the school.
